Links with existing supports / contents  Links with experience etc.	That is the advantage of a third place, because it is more natural. But third places should be everywhere, in all of us.  Culture as a motor for the prevention of social problems. To create a third place, a particular context is needed. Pablo Picasso used to say: To teach people something, you have to mix what they know with what they do not know. It is therefore interesting to offer a space where people recognise themselves, know what is there, and gradually mix with what they do not know. Maybe we need to reverse the pattern by saying that the culture is already there thanks to the new people, and then we will enrich it with other professionals.	
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
